Law and Gospel

Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

There is a story about a pastor, who, after preaching a vivid sermon about sin, death, and damnation, was confronted by one of the Elders of the church. The Elder gently chastised the pastor for being so dramatic in his sermon. The Elder thought that the pastor ought, in future sermons, be a bit less colorful and suggested that pastor refer to sin as a little mistake that people make, hell could be referred to by some other name so as not to unnecessarily frighten our children. “Just don’t go into so much detail,” the Elder suggested.

The pastor listened to the Elder’s suggestions and then invited the Elder into his office. The pastor unlocked one of the cabinets and removed a small container labeled “Strychnine.” There was a large red “skull and crossbones” printed on the label with bold letters stating POISON. The pastor held out the container and asked, “How would you rather this be labeled? I suppose that I could label it Pirate Candy under the skull and crossbones and hope that no one tried it out to see what it tasted like. The milder the label, the more deadly the poison.”

It seems to be part of our fallen human nature to downplay the deadly effects of sin in our lives. Oh, we can readily see and admit that the effects of some of the bigger sins (at least, according to us) like “You shall not murder” should not be minimized. But we tend to soften the seriousness of what we have labeled as “little sins.” We soften these sins by accepting the fact that “everyone is doing it,” or “it’s not hurting anyone,” or “no one will notice,” or some other excusing explanation or belief.

One of the illustrations I used to share with non-believers, as I was attempting to tell them the Gospel story, about the seriousness of sin was concerning the devil himself. Sometime in the distant past the devil opted to disobey God. That act of disobedience was sin. Many other angels followed in the devil’s proverbial footsteps, and they also became sinners by disobeying God. These celestial beings wanted their own way rather than God’s way. The result of their disobedience was the creation of a special place for the devil and his angels. It’s a place that we have come to know as hell (Matthew 25:41). One sin made them want a place without God; they deserved an eternity in hell. And one sin, even one that we might call a little one, is all it takes to make us deserve of an eternity in hell.

You and I understand that we don’t even have to do that one sin to deserve the divine judgment of an eternity in hell. No, every one of us is born under the curse of Original Sin—which means that we are born as condemned sinners. We don’t even have to commit that first sin to deserve condemnation. But that reality wasn’t needed as I was attempting to explain the seriousness of even a single sin to a non-believer. The point I was making is that sin is a killer—sinners deserve to be sent to hell.

The Law of God is frightening—and it should be. Its intent is to reveal to us the seriousness of sin. Sin has the power to separate us from God forever. It’s only when we understand the consequences of our sinfulness that we clearly and fully realize our need for a Savior. That’s what the Law is attempting to do—help us to see our lost condition. But for us, the Law is not an end in itself. The Law’s intent is to move us to repentance (true sorrow over our sins) and then to God’s solution for our sinfulness—His Son, Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world.

Jesus, God in human flesh, came to live among us to provide the necessary sacrifice for our redemption from the just desserts of our sins. Jesus lived a perfect life—never disobeying His heavenly Father. This was more than just showing us that it could be done. Jesus came to be our Redeemer, which means that He was willing to endure the separation from God that our sins demanded. This was the payment required by our sins. On the cross, Jesus suffered and died to make the total payment for our freedom from sin, death, and the devil. His resurrection on the third day proved that the redemption price was satisfactory. That’s the Gospel message that saved you and me.

When I was young time seemed to move slowly. We lived out the axiom “hurry up and wait!” Every day was filled with adventures, chores around the farm, sometimes school assigned homework, fort building in the hay loft, or ruff-housing with my brother Tim and sometimes just mind numbing activities like watching TV. And then there was school... where I sat watching the fish swim in the aquarium or children from the other grades play outside during their recess or my classmates goofing around while the teacher wasn’t looking. The time in school seemed to stand still. The time outside of school flew by way too quickly. I couldn’t imagine anyone intentionally choosing to go to school, no offense to my teachers or those who teach, I just didn’t like be in school. Back then I would have never guessed that I would have attended college 5-8 years and have earned 4 degrees.

Life is a classroom... sometimes mundane, boring, and uneventful and at other times exciting, fast-paced, and packed with activities, but more often than not, it is a combination of both. Often we are in a hurry to get somewhere only to have to wait. For example we might race to the airport two hours before our flight and sit forever to get on the plane. Or we might see someone racing down the road passing everyone in sight only to see them time and time again as we approach stop lights and intersections. And then when we get to where we are going, we discover they were going to the same place we were and only arrived a minute ahead of us. Was it worth the risk to be so impatient on the road... to be in such a hurry... to save a minute of time only to waste it in waiting at their point of destination?

Can you relate... are you in a “hurry up to wait” lifestyle... busy, busy, busy, but not really going anywhere fast and not really getting anything done? Martha was cooking... Mary was sitting... Jesus was talking... are you listening, learning, growing, engaged or too busy to notice?

As we approach Christmas in this season of advent, take time to prepare your heart for the second coming of Jesus Christ, put some oil in your lamp of faith and fill up your reserve container (aka engage in personal Bible study or devotions). Don’t let Christmas activities consume your time and energy without having some built in balance in your life. Hurry up if you must, then wait in and on the Lord in those moments of down time. Jesus is coming again very soon, prepare your heart and your mind for His return. Merry Christmas!

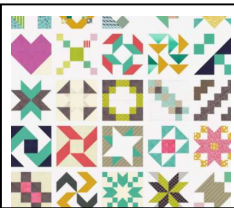

Managing God's Gifts To Us

"We are Accountable"

The need for us to be accountable is well illustrated in the Parable of the Talents found in Matthew 25:14-30. Three servants were entrusted with a lot of money before their master went on a journey. One servant was given five talents, the second servant was given two, and the third was given one. They were given a period of time to put their funds to work. In Matthew 25:19 we read, "After a long time the Master of those servants returned and settled accounts with them." The servants knew the Master would return from his trip, and they would have to give an account of the money given to them. There would be a Day of Judgment, an accounting of their responsibilities. Two servants were very faithful and went out and invested their talents wisely, and they heard the words we all want to hear, "Well done, good and faithful servant." For those who do well, the accounting is a time for rejoicing. If a man is able to turn his talents from five to ten, he is praised for doing good work.

The parable is truly a picture of life itself. We are born into the world with certain talents and abilities which we do not choose. They are gifts from outside us, talents from God. Each of us is given a period of time in which to use these talents – our life span. Then at the end, beyond death, comes judgment, and accounting to render of our days upon earth.

As stewards, we understand our need to be responsible in our stewardship because we know that we at some time will be held accountable. Our accountability does imply hard work and effort. It conveys our responsibilities, not to take our tasks lightly. However, we know that God is always with us, and, with His help and strength, we can accomplish much.

We are accountable to God because He is the creator and owner of all. We become His stewards because He has chosen to entrust us with His love, grace, and mercy for which we are to render faithful and wise service. As the Apostle Paul said in 1 Corinthians 4:2, "Now it is required that those who have been given trust must prove faithful." Jesus' words, recorded in Luke 12: 48 are, "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked."

God, Who loves us and calls us each by name, will enable us to be faithful and accountable stewards.

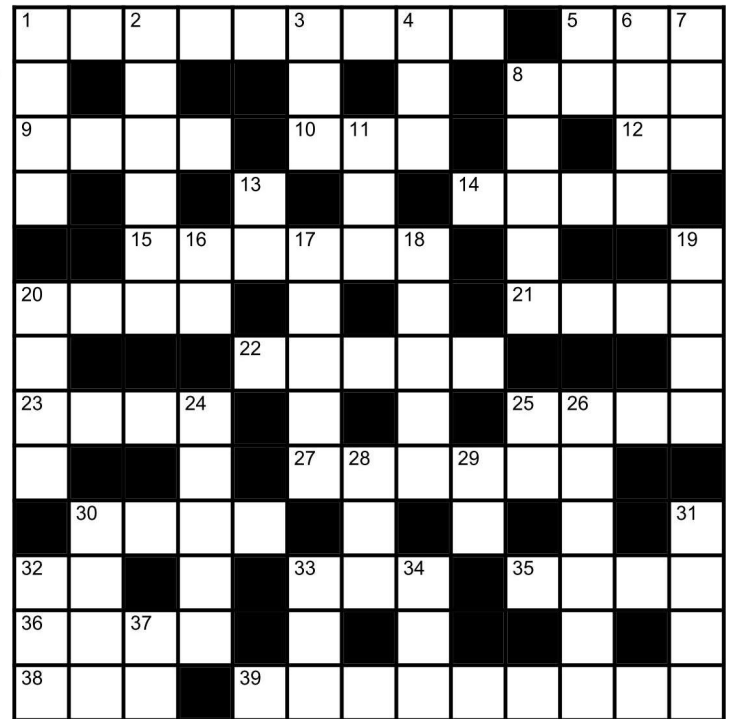
