The Serendipity of Epiphany

Matthew 2:1-2(ESV) ¹Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, ²saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

Serendipity: the faculty or phenomenon of finding valuable or agreeable things not sought for.

I imagine that all of us have had some experience with serendipity. We begin searching for something, but in the process, we find something better. Way back in 1827, John Walker had spent his day mixing chemicals. At the end of the day, he decided to clean his floor. In the process of getting ready to clean, he scraped his mixing stick across the floor and it burst into flames. Matches were created! A bit closer to our time frame, in 1945 Percy Spencer was working around a magnetron. Surprisingly, he felt the chocolate bar in his pocket begin to melt. Wow! The first microwave had been invented. Not long after that, George deMestral, who was a mountain-hiking botanist, stopped to remove some burrs off his socks. He became quite intrigued with the sticking power of the burrs and put them under a microscope. The result—he came up with Velcro[@]. These folks were looking for one thing and found something better. Serendipity!

Years ago, Glenn attended one of my Bible studies regularly. Glenn was a retired man from NW Airlines. He told me the story of how he used to argue with the Christians at work. Glenn was then of the opinion that the Bible was nothing more than a collection of fairy tales. Attempting to improve his argument and better prove his point, Glenn began to read the Bible. He searched for flame throwing evidence he could use to show those misled Christians how wrong they were. And guess what? Through the power of the Word and the Grace of God, Glenn became a believer. He searched the Bible for ammunition to bolster his arguments and found Jesus instead. Serendipity!

Can there be any greater serendipity than when a poor miserable sinner meets Jesus? The New Testament has several examples of exactly that happening. Remember the Samaritan woman who went to the well for water and ended up being found by Jesus and received forgiveness? Matthew went to his tax booth to collect taxes one day and was found by Jesus and given the invitation, "Follow Me." Peter, Andrew, James, and John were doing normal fishermen chores when Jesus came along and offered to make them fishers of men. The widow of Nain was in great distress as she ambled along in the funeral procession of her only son—wondering what was going to happen to her. What happened was Jesus—He restored life to the widow's dead son. Mary Magdalene searched for the dead body of her Lord when she was confronted by a man she supposed to be the gardener. She searched for a much-loved dead person and instead found a risen Christ. Serendipity!

The Good News for you and me today is that the serendipity of Jesus is not limited to past years. No, it goes on right now for the searchers of this world. The world has an untold number of searchers. We search for happiness, for the meaning of life, for true answers, for contentment, for love, and on and on. And in our searching, serendipity sometimes happens. Jesus finds us. And we obtain so much more than what we were initially searching for. Jesus makes Himself known to us. Serendipity!





Recently, my neighbor told me he was going to get a husky puppy, as he'd always loved huskies. I went home and got online to find out

more about their temperament and came across a story about a husky named Nanook.

Nanook lives with his owner near the start of a trail in Alaska's Chugach State Park. The husky was out wandering the trail when he came upon a young deaf woman, who during a three-day hiking trip had tumbled seven hundred feet down a snowy mountain when one of her hiking poles snapped. Nanook spotted her and pulled her to safety.

The husky remained by her side as she continued hiking the trail. And when she slipped and fell again, this time while crossing the strong freezing currents of the Eagle River, Nanook pulled her to dry land by her backpack straps.

To get warm, the woman curled up in her sleeping bag, determined to keep hiking. But Nanook began to lick her face until she finally activated her emergency locator.

After Alaska State Troopers picked them both up, they returned the dog to his owner, who admitted that Nanook often goes wandering off by himself in search of rescue missions.

The woman claimed Nanook was a hero – her guardian angel.

"That's a good kind of dog to have," I told my neighbor the next time I saw him.

Nanook got me thinking, though, about ways I can help others and be their "guardian angel." Though I can't always plan for unexpected opportunities, I can keep my heart open to helping others when an opportunity does come. I don't have to be skilled or have credentials or special talents. I just have to love other people enough to help them when they really need it.

Sunday January 8, 2023 – Zion Special Voters Assembly meeting to call a pastor

Called to order at 2:06 pm by President Carol Prozinski

Attendance: 18 members present (names on file) 1 non-voter present

Devotions: Rev Rehwaldt read Isaiah 42: 1-9 regarding Isaiah's prophetic announcement of Jesus birth and baptism hundreds of years before Jesus was born * Asked God's blessing as the congregation actively seeks a pastor

Overview: Carol P gave an overview of the steps taken with the 4 previous calls which were declined * There were 12 more candidates to review * This time, the committee made contact with the candidates before recommending a call * If we apply for a seminary graduate, that application must be submitted by February 15th

Discussion: Carol P reviewed the candidates * Some had recently taken a call, for some it was not a good time to consider a call, and others were not selected for various reasons * It was noted that about 700 churches nationwide are looking for a pastor and there are under 100 new seminary graduates * If we apply for a graduate, we are not allowed to call another pastor as we wait until May to see if a graduate will be assigned to our church

Recommendation of the Call Committee: Recommend a call to Pastor Marty Mably, currently serving a church in Elk River, MN * If he declines, recommend applying for a seminary graduate

Discussion: Pastor Mably's information was discussed in more detail and questions from the members were answered * Questions regarding Seminary graduates were answered

Motion #1: Michael Gohl motioned to Call Pastor Marty Mably to Zion Lutheran Church * Kelly Gotfredson 2nd * No further discussion * Written vote taken per constitution passed unanimously * Pastor Rehwaldt phoned Pastor Marty Mably and he will consider the call * Pastor Mably asks for prayer as he and his family consider the call * Carol P will send the call document for his consideration and follow up with any questions he may have

Motion #2: As per recommendation, Sheldon Prozinski motioned that if the Call to Pastor Mably is declined, that we proceed with the application to call to a seminary graduate * Kelly Gotfredson 2nd * Written vote passed unanimously * Carol P will send in the application for a seminary graduate if Pastor Mably declines

Motion to adjourn made by Bonnie Gentry * Steven Pederson 2nd * Motion passed

- Adult Confirmation Class: 12 sessions will be completed in February 2023
- Polka Praise Service: Scheduled for April 30 and September 24, 2023
- Pastor's circuit meeting: January 10th at Zion
- Prayer Requests: sent regularly via e-mail
- Rev. Tilahun Mendedo, from Lutheran Bible Translators, will be preaching May 20 & 21

Transfers in - Transfer approval received for Bruce and Gloria Thom from St. Paul's, Royalton * They will officially become Zion members when "voted in" at the Voters Assembly January 29

Financial Reports – Ellen K:

- Keep in mind the 2022 final \$17,022 positive cash flow income would actually be short \$18,922 if we had paid a full-time pastor the past 6 months
- December door offering for the parsonage: \$950.80
- December Fellowship Hall building fund donations of \$6,374 came from Offerings, Thrivent, a Memorial, and Chicks for Bricks * Thanks was expressed for the donations
- Peggy D states that offering envelopes were ordered in June and they have not arrived

Wish List - Carol or Barb: Working on the parsonage needs

Board Reports

Elders – Sheldon P

- Elders did not meet this month
- Expressed the hope a full-time pastor accepts the call so our pastor can retire * Pastor wants to continue Saturday Services
- Church attendance was in 80's for December weekends and 143 at Christmas services
- Visitors discussed * Sending Worship DVDs to additional shut-ins * Reminded that if members are appointed to a board, they are officially "voted in" at the next Voters Assembly
- Spoke of limitations of the janitor for shoveling and moving tables due to outside jobs * The need for a regular Church walk-through was brought up (ie to note problems like the recent water leak in the kitchen) * Janitor duties are flexible and nothing specific is written down

Trustees – Keith S

- Kitchen had a recent water leak along the wall due to ice building up on the roof * The flat roof collects water/freezes/thaws * Trustees fixed it by plugging in heat tape
- Waiting on parts for flickering lights outside the fellowship hall
- Baseboards are being fixed in the fellowship hall.
- Dishwasher not working properly *Parts ordered *Use paper plates till further notice
- New coil for coffee maker ordered
- Comments received that the sanctuary is cold and will follow up with the fan speed
- Trustees reassure members that there are no bats in the basement
- Comments about the parsonage will be covered under old business

Youth / Education – Amanda D

- It works best to have Youth/Ed meetings on Zoom
- They would like to host the Ash Wed meal and Easter breakfast
- Looking to provide youth activities in February/March.
- Vacation Bible School (VBS) with supper is budgeted/ scheduled for June 5-8, 5:30-8 pm

Stewardship – Marlyn P

- Lenten denial folders have been ordered
- Door offerings at Zion are regularly scheduled for the 3rd weekend of the month January: Faith by hearing, Military Bible Stick February: Lutheran Hour Ministries March: Morrison County food shelf * We join the county-wide March promotion

Evangelism – Sue V

- Committee met this morning * Due to vacations and lack of members, next meeting is April 3 * We need more Evangelism members Call the church office if interested
- Sue Vosen and Judy Drewlow will be the co-chairs. (Marilyn H will still help sometimes)
- 3 Large print orders of Divine services printed weekly * Barb J will follow up on a new large print hymnal recently published and determine if it would meet Zion's needs
- American Red Cross Blood Drive at Zion: Thursday, April 20, 2023 from 11a.m.- 5p.m.
- The outdoor free little library will be closed till Easter Sunday April 9th * The books have been temporarily removed * Rubber bands currently hold door shut on windy days and plan to add a hook in the spring * Members are encouraged to continue to bring Christian themed books, magazines, coloring books etc and place them in the box in the narthex
- Looking into ways to finance and install a nice-looking sturdy bench in the butterfly garden area behind the church * We will get input from trustees regarding this project
- It was suggested Evangelism organize the materials in the Narthex * Those interested in helping should come an hour early before the February Council meeting to do this.

Old Business:

- 1. Pastoral Call Update Carol P
- The Jan 8, 2p.m. Voters Assembly meeting was overseen by Rev. Rehwaldt from the MN North District *18 Zion members were present * There was a unanimous written vote to call Pastor Marty Mably who is currently serving a church in Elk River, MN * Pre-calls were made and another call will be made to clarify any questions and review insurance needs before a final call document is sent * We will also send an invite to visit Zion
- If Pastor Mably declines, the Voters Assembly written vote was unanimous to extend a call to a seminary graduate * The seminary application will be submitted by February 15 if Pastor Mably declines * Seminary graduate placements will be announced by May
- Everyone is encouraged to keep praying for a full-time pastor
- 2. Parsonage Update Carol P
- A summary of parsonage upgrades, costs, suppliers and contractors will be included in the annual report. The shortfall to date is \$1,714.52 * No other anticipated expenses
- Keith S will organize a celebratory breakfast to help offset the parsonage shortfall
- Thanks to all who gave time and money for the parsonage upgrades
- We do not pay taxes, but the tax value of the parsonage before upgrades was \$181,400

- After discussion of reasons previous pastors declined our call:
 - Carol P motioned to increase the midpoint pay synod recommends for our area by \$4,000 annually for a field pastor or a new graduate * Keith S 2nd * Motion carried
 - Carol P motioned to change Parsonage valuation to \$15,000 annually * Ellen K 2nd * Motion passed




